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**RE:** Nebraska 2<sup>nd</sup> Congressional District Survey Results

**DATE** October 7, 2020

A survey<sup>1</sup> of Nebraska 2<sup>nd</sup> Congressional District voters likely to cast a ballot in the November election shows Democratic candidates in a strong position with four weeks until Election Day. As Figure 1 shows, Joe Biden leads Donald Trump by 11-points (53%-42%) in the Presidential race and in the race for Congress, and Democratic challenger Kara Eastman is ahead of Republican Don Bacon by 2-points (47%-45%). Among those voters who say they have already voted (18% of the sample) Biden is up 25-points and Eastman has a similarly large, 23-point advantage over Bacon.

These survey results show Democrats Joe Biden and Kara Eastman to be well-positioned for the final stretch of the campaign.

<sup>1</sup> **Survey Methodology:** FM3 conducted a survey of 450 randomly selected Nebraska 2<sup>nd</sup> Congressional District voters likely to cast a ballot in the November election from October 1-4, 2020; African Americans were oversampled. Interviews were via landline and cell phones by live interviewers. The full sample margin of error is +/-4.6% at the 95% confidence level; the margin of error for population subgroups will be higher. Due to rounding, some percentages may not sum to 100%.
